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

- Maintaining a European network since 2007
  - Sub-regional exchange and workshops
  - Twinning, Peer- to- peer exchange & regular webinars
  - Joint annual exercises- JADE 25-27<sup>th</sup> November 2025
  - IHRNFP Knowledge network

### The National IHR Authority network Coordinating overall IHR implementation

- New! Entered into force in September 2025
- National Designation ongoing, with deadline of 31 December

(risk communication, community engagement and infodemic management)

#### Preparedness for mass gatherings Germany, France, Italy and Portugal NPHIs

Joint public health advice for travellers with WHO/Europe and ECDC

- Consistent, evidence-based messaging across all countries.
- Third-party validation to reinforce trust and credibility.
- Official information sources and counter false information.

### RCCE- IM capacity building Belgium and Germany NPHIs

Implementation of new online tools to map capabilities and build plans

- Translation and localization to ensure accessibility and relevance
- Technical guidance on tool use and process adaptation
- WHO/Europe support for coordinated national implementation

#### Global Outbreak Alert and Response Network (GOARN)

- **22 NPHIs in the WHO European Region are members** of the (GOARN)
- GOARN Deployment mechanisms for experts from NPHIs

#### Emergency Medical Teams (EMT) Initiative

- Integrating PH experts from NPHIs into EMT capacities
- EMT Deployment mechanisms for experts from NPHIs in outbreak scenario
